## **Canada Games Team Selection Criteria 2011 Team BC**

2011 CANADA WINTER GAMES ARCHERY (INDOOR) Halifax 2011 February 11-27<sup>th</sup>, Archery Schedule yet to be announced.

### **PARTICIPANTS:**

Competitors: 2 Males and 2 Females (one each in Compound and Recurve)

Staff: 1 Manager and 1 Coach; one of the team staff must be male, and one of the team staff must be female.

### **CLASSIFICATION:**

Under 22 as of January 1, 2011

Year of Birth: Born in the calendar year 1989 or later

---

### **COMPETITION:**

FCA RULES of shooting will govern the event. The Indoor Olympic Round is shot **entirely on 40cm vertical triple faces**. A Province/Territory may enter 1 competitor in each of the four categories (i.e., 1 Compound male, 1 Recurve male, 1 Compound female, and 1 Recurve female).

### **ELIGIBILITY:**

#### **Coaches:**

Any staff listed as coaches on the official registration form must be fully certified (theory, technical and practical) under the National Coaching Certification Program to at

least Level 3 in Archery, or the equivalent in the new NCCP Competition Stream, Development Context (Trained Status). These coaches must be so certified not later than 90 days before the opening of the Games (i.e. by November 13, 2010).

### **Competitors:**

The Games are open to athletes, who are members in good standing of their provincial and/or national sport organization.

An athlete is permitted to try out for **only one** province or territory per Games.

Excluded from the Canada Games are:

- a) Athletes that have held a Senior card (as defined by Sport Canada's Athlete Assistance program) at any time;
- b) Athletes that have competed for any nation at any Pan American Games or Olympic Games, or Paralympic Games.

No athlete can be rendered ineligible within 90 days of the opening of the Games due to carding status or national team status (i.e., no athlete will be excluded if they become National Senior Team members for the first time or are granted carding status after November 13, 2010).

An athlete's permanent domicile or actual residence must be located, for at least the 180 days prior to the opening of the Games, within the recognized boundaries of the province or territory they are representing. An athlete can have only one domicile. Students attending school on a full-time basis outside their province of permanent residence during the year of the Games shall be permitted to compete for either their province of permanent residence or the province in which the athlete attends school. To be eligible to compete for the province where the athlete attends school, the student must be enrolled on a full-time basis during the 2010-2011 academic year.

Exceptions to the domicile requirement will be possible if the athlete can demonstrate a commitment to the province or territory she or he wishes to represent by such means as having been a member of a club or provincial sport organization in that province for the entire previous competitive season, having represented that province or territory at a previous national or regional championship, or having attended school full-time the previous academic year, or a recognized national training centre full-time during the previous 12 months. Other similar circumstances may be considered.

### **Requirements for Team BC identification:**

- 1) Athlete must be a member of the BC Archery Association in Good Standing
- 2) Athlete must declare their intentions to qualify for Team BC 2011 in writing to

the support staff by the Monday immediately following the 2010 BC Outdoor Championships, (date to be announced) This declaration must be signed by legal guardian, if one is applicable.

3) A proof of shooting history must be included in the declaration.

Preferred scores and placements are the:

- JOP Indoors 2009 and or 2010, JOP Outdoors 2009/ 2010
- Provincial Championships Indoors 2009 and / or 2010
- 3-D Provincial Championships Indoors / or out 2009 and or 2010

### **Qualifying Process:**

Three (3) designated qualifier events will be scheduled from September 2010 to November 2010. Athletes must attend and shoot a minimum of two (2) events. Each event will consist of a (1) 60-arrow FITA I round and (2) a minimum of two (2) Elimination rounds. Athletes must compete and submit scores from the following components.

1. Qualifying round - a 60 arrow FITA I round.
2. Elimination rounds

Any athlete shooting a Qualifying Event must declare that event as a “Qualifying Score” prior to start of event. Score card(s) must be signed by an Event Official and submitted to Paul Greening for record.

Each component of the qualifying process will carry equal weight. Scorecards must be submitted for ranking to Susan Lemke / Paul Greening **within one week of the qualifying event**.

### **Team Selection Process:**

Scores submitted from designated events will be tallied and the athletes will be ranked accordingly.

1. Qualifying round – A minimum of two (2) scores must be submitted. The average of the two (2) FITA I scores will be used for ranking purposes. If the athlete decides to shoot all three (3) qualifying events, the average of all three (3) scores will be used for ranking.
2. Elimination rounds – Four (4) total scores can be submitted. Elimination round points will be awarded as follows
  - 5 for highest scoring match play across each category men’s women’s.
  - 5, 4, 3, points awarded down to 1.
  - Score Cards to be submitted to Paul Greening

- Elimination scores will be used for evaluation of participation and tie breaking

The top ranked individual from each category (highest FITA I round score average) will be named to the team.

In the Case of a Tie:

All will be broken based on the submitted FITA 1 round scores and using the Canada Winter Games format.

- Greatest number of 10's (inner 10's for compound)
- If still tied, the greatest number of 9's
- If still tied, the tie shall be broken using the points awarded for the Elimination Round score.

*Injury or inability to complete a qualifying round*

If an athlete is unable to complete a qualifying event due to injury or medical condition, that individual will be allowed to complete the qualification round at the next Qualifying Event. The athlete will resume shooting where he/she had originally stopped because of the medical condition. If the event happens at the last qualifier event, FITA rules would apply as they pertain to an injury delay.
