## BC Archers at Canada Winter Games

BC's young and previously un-tested Archery team defied the odds and came home from the Canada Winter Games with a team medal and 3 more for individuals: NAMES

BC Archers stepped indoors to the Fita I or 18 meter round - an event that requires Recurve (or Olympic) shooters to score a ten hit the size of a quarter at 60 feet, and that requires Compound shooters (the style with wheels) to score a ten hit in a diameter the size of a dime at 60 feet. The calibre of our BC shooters was such that this was not a difficult task; however, add good archers from around the country, a scoreboard that was being updated every round, a crowd of 100 people or more, media, hours of travel time to and from venues, eating schedules and unaccustomed sleeping accommodations, and the challenge begins to grow exponentially.

Now is a good time to remember that most of BC's Archers this year were 17 to 18 years old, some older some younger. - and all were competing for the medals of a lifetime.

But the Team's Leader, Susan Lemke, says that "I considered myself a member of a pretty remarkable team. Every one of us had some amount of preconceived ideas of what to expect - but as it turned out, most of us really had no idea. We had to get out of bed by 5:30 am, breakfast and loaded on a bus by 7:00 am.

## West Nile Info for Outdoor Folks

(Cont'd from page 1) By Susan Lemke.

At this time the largest concerns regarding the West Nile disease is for horses. The disease itself infects birds, over 110 species known at this time including crows, magpies, ravens and jays. The West Nile Virus infects mammals, people, horses, bears, deer, cats, bats, skunks, chipmunk, squirrels, and domestic rabbits. These seem to be the dead end host. There has been no evidence that the disease moves or is transmitted from an animal to a person or from person to person. The disease is transmitted via mosquito. Not every mosquito is infected, government statistics estimate about 2% or less. Also less than 1% of infected humans develop severe illness. The most vulnerable being older persons, babies and people with weak immune systems. The largest complaint from infected people is mild flu-like symptoms such as fever, headaches, and body aches which occur between 3-15 days after the mosquito bite. Some cases of rash, swollen lymph glands have been reported. There have been cases where the virus have crossed the blood-brain barrier and caused meningitis or encephalitis (swelling of the spinal cord or the brain), high fever, stiff neck, vomiting, drowsiness, confusion, muscle weakness, paralysis, tremors, etc. Prevention is the recommended advice, cover exposed skin when outdoors, wear light coloured clothing and use a repellent containing DEET.

Travel for an hour, if the weather conditions were good. Hurry up and wait their turn to compete. Then back on a bus to return to the village by 6:00 or 6:30 pm for dinner by 7:00 and hour or so to unwind then, phone calls home, internet mail, socializing, etc. then off to bed." Add to that 4 feet of snow and -24 degree temperatures, the distance from home, family and support, and the stress of competition can easily be seen. The cold-induced Asthma, ear infections, sore throats, etc. were all problems for which the athletes had to support each other - by staying positive and listening when they expressed their stresses and vented their doubts and frustrations. Susan adds "everyone contributed time and ideas - and everyone respected each other's opinions". Another big key was staying flexible and keeping in the information loop - and making the most of the great support provided by the mission staff. Overall,

though, the theme and focus of the entire team was first and foremost athlete-centred.

And from the results, it seems to have worked!

### J.O.P. on Salt Spring!


This February, Salt Spring revived its JOP program. About 5 years ago, Salt Spring had a very popular JOP program run by Betty Peters and her husband Stan. When Betty left the island, the JOP program was discontinued. Over the years, the Salt Spring Island Rod and Gun Club has had Junior Archery Programs and while they were very popular, they did not have the structure of the JOP program and were not sustained year round.

The new JOP program was started by offering two 10-week archery courses - one starting about 4 weeks after the first. The one class runs on Monday night and the other on Tuesday night. The 10-week course fee was \$65 which covered Rod and Gun club membership and BCAA membership and all range fees and equipment use fees for the duration of the course. One class has 21 members from 8 - 16 years old and the other has a similar age range with 11 members.

After the course, the JOP members will be able to shoot on regular JOP days and under supervision at any time at the club. To this point all shooting has been done indoors at 18m but the program will move outdoors shortly. Keith Newman, owner of Newman's Great Out-

doors store on Salt Spring, has been the driving force in organizing the program and has expanded the offerings in his store to include a good range of basic archery equipment. Cam Cartwright has assisted the program by performing the much-needed equipment maintenance function.

One of the main challenges facing the club has been the fact that most of the equipment has had to be purchased and the club's funds are very limited. To help with the purchase of new bows and arrows, the club held a raffle with prizes donated by local businesses.

## First Annual Zone Six J.O.P. Championships

The first annual Zone 6 JOP Indoor Championship was held at Cowichan Bowmen on March 23, 2003. Unfortunately, no archers from Powell River were able to attend but 12 archers from Victoria, 11 from Salt Spring, 7 from Parksville and 5 from Cowichan competed. JOP levels were used regardless of gender and equipment to ensure that there was some good competition at the event. For many archers, this was their first exposure to competition and it enabled them to experience a tournament in a low-pressure environment. Another significant benefit was the opportunity for less experienced archers to see experienced JOP archers from other clubs shooting more sophisticated equipment and achieving higher scores than they had been exposed to previously.

To add to the excitement there was a Club Trophy awarded to the club with the best performance. The formula used to determine the winning club took into account the performance of each archer relative to his/her current JOP level and then that performance was averaged over all the archers from that club. The winning club was the one whose archers performed best on average given their current JOP level. A loud round of applause accompanied the award presentation to host club, Cowichan Bowmen.
