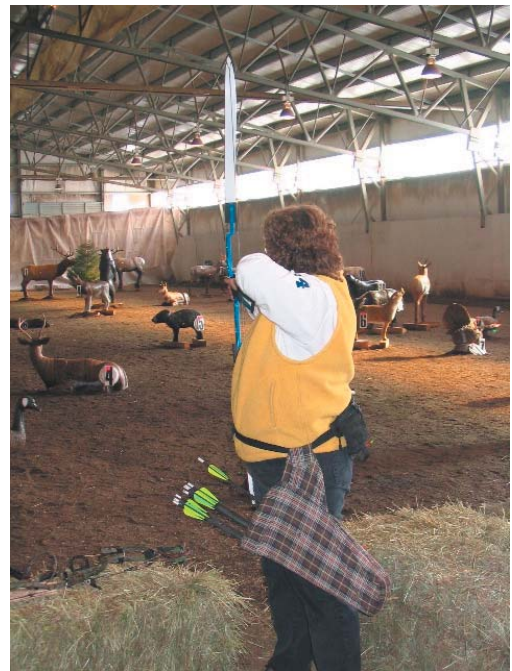

## 2004 NORTHERN BC 3D CHAMPIONSHIPS

Silvertip Archers hosted their 3rd Annual 3D Indoor Tournament Feb 14-15. They had 134 competitors this year, an increase of 32 from last year. The attendance was amazing and people from Smithers, Williams Lake, Pouce Coupe, Vanderhoof, Quesnel and Mackenzie traveled to the event.

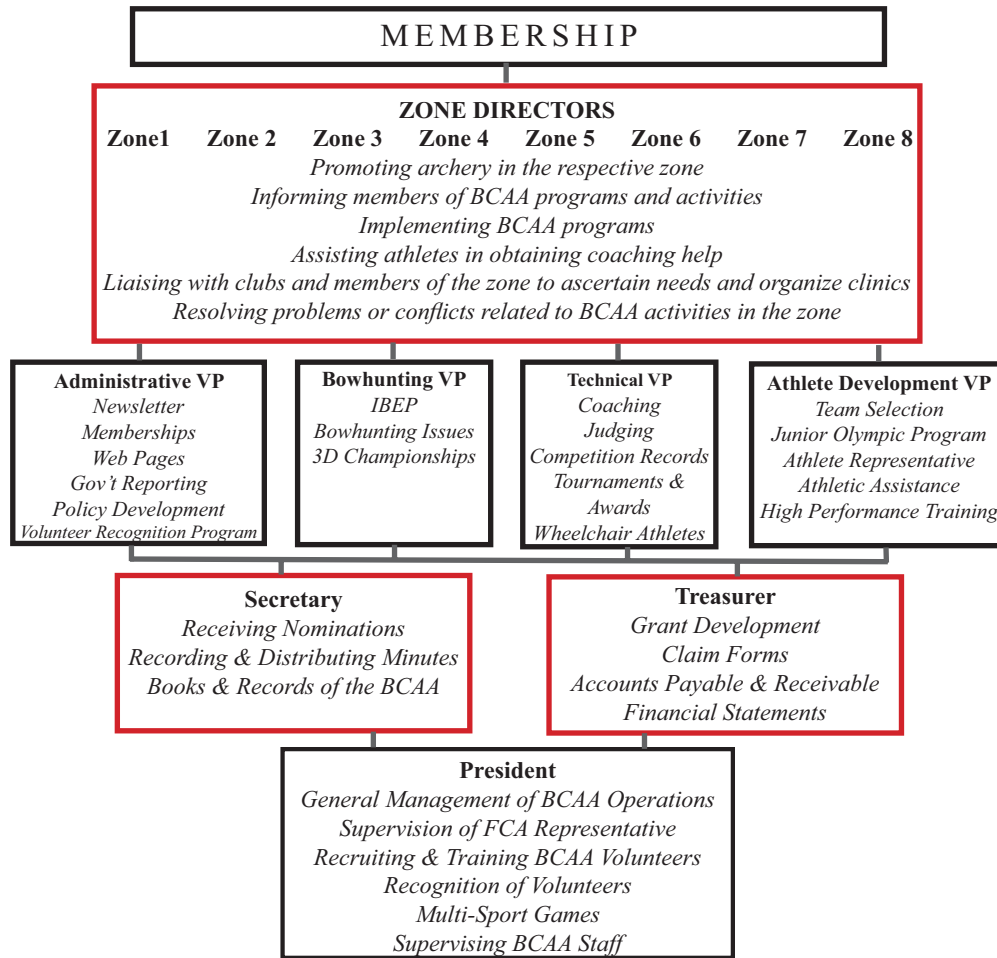

Names, resumés, and ballots will be published in the May-June issue of the BC Archer. Voting is by done by mailing your vote by August 1, 2004 to the BCAA Secretary. All members 18 years and over have a right to vote in their zone for a Zone Director. Everyone is strongly encouraged to vote. It is the membership's responsibility to elect a strong Zone Director – the health of the BCAA depends on it.

### ZONE DIRECTOR RESPONSIBILITIES:

Each Zone Director represents one of the eight regional zones as established by the provincial organization, Sport BC. (See back page for zone info). Responsibilities for Zone Director are as follows:

The Zone Director shall:

- Act as the representative of the Society and to promote archery in the respective zone
- Inform the members of and publicize the programs and activities of the Society in the zone
- Assist in the implementation of Society programs in the zone
- Attempt to resolve any problems or conflicts dealing with Society activities in the zone
- Bring zone problems to the Board to help resolve issues of concern
- Help promote and organize clinics
- Assist athletes in obtaining coaching help
- Liaise with the clubs and members of the zone to ascertain clinic needs
- For zones 7 and 8, responsibilities will include representing zone members for the BC Northern Winter Games
- Upon retirement, arrange for the election of a replacement zone director

## 2004 Canadian Nationals - July 31 – August 7 – Caledon, ON

### B. C. Target Team Selection Criteria

The team selection criteria are reviewed each year by the Board of Directors of the BCAA. We attempt to establish criteria that are both objective, for the basic selection, and flexible enough to consider external influences such as budget restrictions and considerations for the potential for individual medals. We also consider team contribution and contributions given to our sport when making the selection. In order for scores to be considered for selection, an athlete must be a member of the BCAA and must declare his/her intention to be available for the team in writing by **May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2004**. Scores must be sent to Susan Lemke and must be received (or postmarked) on or before **July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2004** to be considered.

To select a team to the Nationals, we will use the top four FITA Stars, Canadian FITAs and/or B.C. registered FITAs, three (3) of which must be shot in the current outdoor season. B.C.-only FITAs must be registered with the BCAA team selection administrator, Susan Lemke, prior to the event; the appropriate paperwork must be sent to Ron Ostermeier; and, they must be judged by qualified Officials. Tournament summary sheets must be sent to the administrator by the tournament director and officiating timing sheets must be sent to Ron Ostermeier. It is, however, the ultimate Responsibility of the archer to ensure that his/her score is registered. A signed copy of the score card will be an acceptable proof of achievement.

A candidate with at least one Field Round within the past year, for the purpose of experience in the field, will be considered first for the position within a given category. Athletes wishing to participate in a category beyond their regulation age category must receive written permission from the Board to be eligible for funding. The selection period starts July 2nd, 2003 and extends to July 1st, 2004.

The minimum qualifying score for selection to the team will be an average score of 95% of the FCA Canadian Championship record. Each team member will receive \$500 to defray expenses. In making the team selection, the BCAA Board of Directors will consider funding first, standing within individual shooting categories second and team selection (Fred Usher Memorial Cup) third. Only members of the selected Team BC will be considered to participate in the Fred Usher Memorial Cup team round. With priority given to 70 meter scores first.

Minimum age for the National event is 15 years of age at the time of the tournament, unless the participant is accompanied by a parent or guardian. If extra funding is available from other sources, beyond our regular grant, specifically for a particular category, it may transcend these rules of selection. Local transportation for the team will be provided by the team's rented van, augmented if possible by archers' and volunteers' vehicles.

The following table shows the National record and the qualifying score. These scores were taken from the FCA internet site as of February 25/2004. The FCA site will be taken to be correct in case there are any errors in the table below.

# 2004 3D Canadian Nationals – July 30 – August 2 – Prince George

## BC 3D Team Selection Criteria

### Competitors:

Must be a paid up member of the BCAA, or have membership paid at the same time as their declaration of intention.

Must declare his/her intentions to be available for the team in writing by **March 15, 2004**. Current members may email their intentions to [tedkennedy@shaw.ca](mailto:tedkennedy@shaw.ca). Intentions may be mailed and must be postmarked by **March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2004** and sent to **Ted Kennedy 10351 167A Street, Surrey, BC V4N 5H2**.

Must declare the class in which the archer is going to shoot in. Classes will be as found in the FCA rules, as these will be the rules and classes shot at the Provincials, and the Nationals. Classes may be found at the following website <http://www.e-bizinus.com/FCA/Rules> in Chapter 11.21.

Must submit 3 score cards from 3 different 3D shoots, witnessed and dated (by the official running the event), in the declared class, plus shoot the BC Provincial 3D Championships at Nechako Valley Archers, Vanderhoof, on June 19<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup>, 2004. Placement in the BC Provincial 3D Championships will be used to select the team.

The Team shall be the top 8 archers in 8 different classes. All Adult classes of the competition will be considered. However; a handicapping system, provided to the BCAA board by a committee, will be used to select the top 8 classes out of the 17 possible adult classes represented. The handicapping system is found in Scoring Table A.

All team members must sign an athlete code of conduct. Team members will receive the following from the BCAA: Team Jacket, shirt, coaching, funding support paid at the 3D Nationals (\$400-\$600), and a team leader/coach at the 3D Nationals.

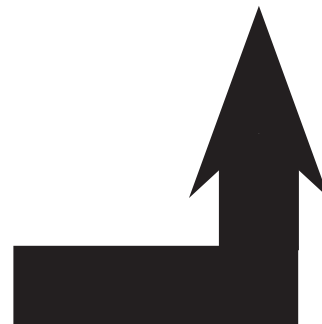
