Wright takes third at world 3D archery championships

Samantha Wright of Quesnel finished third in the World 3D championships in Latina, Italy.

In the bronze medal match, Wright faced Irene Franchini of Italy. The pair ended the round tied 38 - 38. Wright secured the bronze medal ending the Italian 10 - 5 in a tie break.

Wright, three-time defending Canadian 3D archery champion, was seeded number one after two days of competition.

In the semi-final match, against fourth seed Shenaida Merida Morena of Spain, Wright was outscored 36 - 33.

News From FITA

News from FITA: From Al Wills

It was a busy set of meetings in Ulsan Korea this year, which will shape the future of FITA and shooting internationally, here are just some of the motions that will affect us all:

New Distances for Masters:

- As of January 1, 2010, masters will shoot the same distances as cadets (Longest distance: 70M for men/60M for women)
- If Masters wish to shoot the longer distances, then they compete as seniors.

New Age Limits for Juniors and Cadets:

- Cadet will now be up to and including the year of 17th birthday and Juniors up to and including the year of their 20th birthday.

New Target Faces/6 arrows at 50 & 30:

- A new target face is being developed to allow for the shooting of 6 arrows at 50 and 30 metres, it will probably be a 5 – 10 ring target with 2 centres. This will allow for shooting of 6 arrows at all FITA distances.

Shooting Time Change:

- There will now be only 10 seconds to get to the line.
- Time for alternate shooting reduced to 20 seconds.

New Compound Round:

- As of January 1, 2011 the compound qualification round will be shot consisting of 72 arrows at 50M on an 80cm face.
- The elimination round will be on a 'hit/miss' target (no scores, either you hit it or not). Matches will be 4 sets of 3 arrows. This round will be shot as a trial round at all 2010 World Cup tournaments.
- The hit/miss zone is 10cm

New Recurve Elimination Round:

As of April 1, 2010 all matches will be shot in sets.

- Winner of a set is the archer with the highest end for that set (2 points, if the score is tied each

gets 1 point).

- 6 arrows/set – best 3 sets (minimum of 2 sets (ends)) 1/64,1/32, 1/16, 1/8 eliminations.
- 3 arrows/set – best of 5 (minimum of 3 sets (ends)) 1/4s and up
- Tie breaking procedures will be used.

New Mixed Teams:

World Championships will have mixed teams (Male Female using the same equipment) – Canada won a bronze in the test event this year.

Field will probably be replaced by the new compound rounds at the World Games

Preliminary meetings were held by the Commonwealth Nations (us included) to form a Commonwealth Archery Association to try and maintain archery in the Commonwealth Games.

There are a number of others, such as changes to the requirement to fill out your scorecard properly and consequences if you don't, so you might want to start working on your math skills. All in all I saw a genuine regard for archers at these meetings.

As you can see some changes are still in a bit of a 'concept' mode and details will come out later. There is no guarantee that all of these changes will find their way into the Canadian rule book as that is the choice of the Board of Directors, they will decide what they see as the best rules to implement here. Watch FCA and BCAA for further announcements.

Please feel free to pass comments onto me; BCAA/FCA and FITA are interested in all feedback.

World Championships

On the World Championships:

It was most interesting to see the level of interesting target archery in Korea, Ulsan is a industrial city on the south east coast, with a population of approximately 1 million. It has a huge ship yard and an oil refinery in the middle of the city.

The city supported the archery competition whole heartedly, there were archery championship banners on literally every light standard and most bridges had banners on them. The mayor was in the stands most days of the competition.

The competition field was unbelievable for us in the West. Imagine a purpose built target field for more than 100 butts, with the entire shooting line covered. (For competitions the archers shoot on the grass in front of it). There are spectator bleachers behind 75% of the shooting line with a large 'Jumo-tron TV behind each one. A huge jumbo-tron dominated the centre of the field behind the butts! There is full time accommodations for their resident athletes just outside the venue.

I have never seen archery facility that even compares to this and there are 2 others in other Korean cities. I've attached some pictures to give you an idea of the size and grandeur of the facility.

Gwen's Chocolate Cake

2 c. white Sugar
1 $\frac{3}{4}$ c. flour
 $\frac{3}{4}$ c. unsweetened cocoa
2 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp. baking powder
 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt
Sift together dry ingredients into a large bowl.

2 med. eggs
1 c. buttermilk or 1 c. milk with lemon juice or vinegar
1 c. strong cold black coffee
 $\frac{1}{2}$ c. vegetable oil
1 tsp vanilla
Combine wet ingredients into a small bowl.

Pour wet ingredients into dry ingredients and mix well. Batter will be very thin & runny. Pour into a 13" x 9" x 2" pan or make into cupcakes. Bake at 350 F. for 35-40 mins (less time for cupcakes) or until a toothpick comes out clean when stuck into the middle of the cake or cupcakes. This recipe is excellent for freezing. I have frozen cupcakes for over a year before defrosting & they are as moist as the day they were baked.

Chili Con Carne

1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups red kidney beans, soaked overnight
3 bacon slices
1 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb beef chuck steak, stewing beef or hamburger (cut meat into $\frac{1}{2}$ " cubes)
1 c. onions, chopped
1 clove garlic split
1 can tomatoes - 16 oz.
1 $\frac{1}{2}$ tbsp. Chili powder
1 tbsp. Salt

Wash beans and soak overnight in enough cold water to cover beans. Next day drain the beans. Place in a very large saucepan; put in 2 quarts of water and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours or until beans are soft. Drain off excess water.

Meanwhile, cut up bacon and cook for 2 minutes in a large saucepan. Add meat to bacon & brown. Remove bacon and meat then cook onions until tender. Stir in all ingredients including beans. Simmer for at least 2 hours to all day. If it doesn't have enough chili powder, add more to taste.

Note: beef can be substituted with venison or moose meat or even combinations of meats. I prefer using moose as it has a stronger flavour.

Camping/hunting suggestions:

To save room and make life easier, plan your meals ahead of time so that you will not have an overload of food to bring back home. If staying in a motel or have the availability of electricity, take a slow cooker. This way you could put on a stew or chili before leaving and on your return there is a hot meal waiting.
