# 2011 Canada Games Selection Criteria



## Canada Games Team Selection Criteria 2011 Team BC

**2011 CANADA WINTER GAMES ARCHERY (INDOOR)** Halifax 2011 February 11-27th, Archery Schedule yet to be announced.

### **PARTICIPANTS:**

Competitors: 2 Males and 2 Females (one each in Compound and Recurve)

Staff: 1 Manager and 1 Coach; one of the team staff must be male, and one of the team staff must be female.

### **CLASSIFICATION:**

Under 22 as of January 1, 2011 Year of Birth: Born in the calendar year 1989 or later

### **COMPETITION:**

FCA RULES of shooting will govern the event. The Indoor Olympic Round is shot entirely on 40cm vertical triple faces. A Province/Territory may enter 1 competitor in each of the four categories (i.e., 1 Compound male, 1 Recurve male, 1 Compound female, and 1 Recurve female). Provincial/Territorial Team Event

### **ELIGIBILITY:**

Coaches:

Any staff listed as coaches on the official registration form must be fully certified (theory, technical and practical) under the National Coaching Certification Program to at least Level 3 in Archery, or the equivalent in the new NCCP Competition Stream, Development Context (Trained Status). These coaches must be so certified not later than 90 days before the opening of the Games (i.e. by November 13, 2010).

### **COMPETITORS:**

The Games are open to athletes, who are members in good standing of their provincial and/or national sport organization.

An athlete is permitted to try out for only one province or territory per Games.

Excluded from the Canada Games are:

a) Athletes that have held a Senior card (as defined by Sport Canada's Athlete Assistance program) at any time;

b) Athletes that have competed for any nation at any Pan American Games or Olympic Games, or Paralympic Games.

No athlete can be rendered ineligible within 90 days of the opening of the Games due to carding status or national team status (i.e., no athlete will be excluded if they become National Senior Team members for the first time or are granted carding status after November 13, 2010).

An athlete's permanent domicile or actual residence must be located, for at least the 180 days prior to the opening of the Games, within the recognized boundaries of the province or territory they are representing. An athlete can have only one domicile. Students attending school on a full-time basis outside their province of permanent residence during the year of the Games shall be permitted to compete for either their province of permanent residence or the province in which the athlete attends school. To be eligible to compete for the province where the athlete attends school, the student must be enrolled on a full-time basis during the 2010-2011 academic year.

Exceptions to the domicile requirement will be possible if the athlete can demonstrate a commitment to the province or territory she or he wishes to represent by such means as having been a member of a club or provincial sport organization in that province for the entire previous

competitive season, having represented that province or territory at a previous national or regional championship, or having attended school full-time the previous academic year, or a recognized national training centre full-time during the previous 12 months. Other similar circumstances may be considered.

Requirements for Team BC identification:

1) Athlete must be a member of the BC Archery Association in Good Standing

2) Athlete must declare their intentions to qualify for Team BC 2011 in writing to the support staff by the Monday immediately following the 2010 BC Outdoor Championships, (date to be announced) This declaration must be signed by legal guardian, if one is applicable.

3) A proof of shooting history must be included in the declaration.

Preferred scores and placements are the:

- JOP Indoors 2009 and or 2010, JOP Outdoors 2009/ 2010
- Provincial Championships Indoors 2009 and / or 2010
- 3-D Provincial Championships 2009 and or 2010

### **QUALIFYING PROCESS:**

Three (3) designated qualifier events will be scheduled from September 2010 to November 2010. Athletes must attend and shoot a minimum of two (2) events. Each event will consist of a (1) 60-arrow FITA I round and (2) a minimum of two (2) Elimination rounds. Athletes must compete and submit scores from the following components.

1. Qualifying round - a 60 arrow FITA I round.

2. Elimination rounds

Any athlete shooting a Qualifying Event must declare that event as a "Qualifying Score" prior to start of event. Score

card(s) must be signed by an Event Official and submitted to Paul Greening for record.

Each component of the qualifying process will carry equal weight. Scorecards must be submitted for ranking to Susan Lemke / Paul Greening within one week of the qualifying event.

## TEAM SELECTION PROCESS:

Scores submitted from designated events will be tallied and the athletes will be ranked accordingly.

1. Qualifying round – A minimum of two (2) scores must be submitted. The average of the two (2) FITA I scores will be used for ranking purposes. If the athlete decides to shoot all three (3) qualifying events, the average of all three (3) scores will be used for ranking.

2. Elimination rounds – Four (4) total scores can be submitted. Elimination round points will be awarded as follows

- 5 for highest scoring match play across each category men's women's.
- 5, 4, 3, points awarded down to 1.
- Score Cards to be submitted to Paul Greening
- Elimination scores will be used for evaluation of participation and tie breaking

The top ranked individual from each category (highest FITA I round score average) will be named to the team.

## In the Case of a Tie:

All will be broken based on the submitted FITA 1 round scores and using the Canada Winter Games format.

- Greatest number of 10's (inner 10's for compound)
- If still tied, the greatest number of 9's
- If still tied, the tie shall be broken using the points awarded for the Elimination Round score.

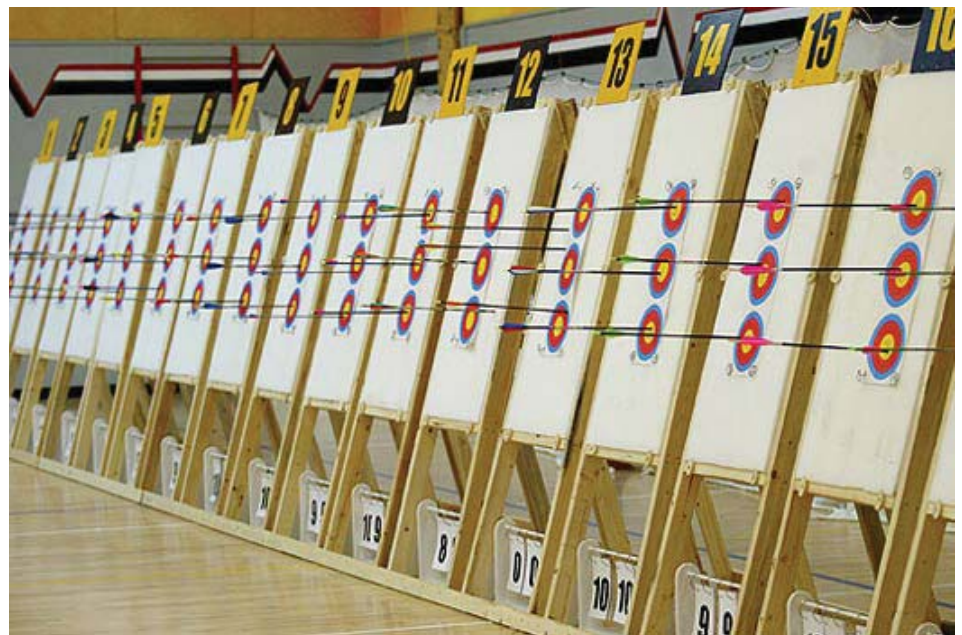
## Injury or inability to complete a qualifying round:

If an athlete is unable to complete a qualifying event due to injury or medical condition, that individual will be allowed to complete the qualification round at the next Qualifying Event. The athlete will resume shooting where he/she had originally stopped because of the medical condition. If the event happens at the last qualifier event, FITA rules would apply as they pertain to an injury delay.

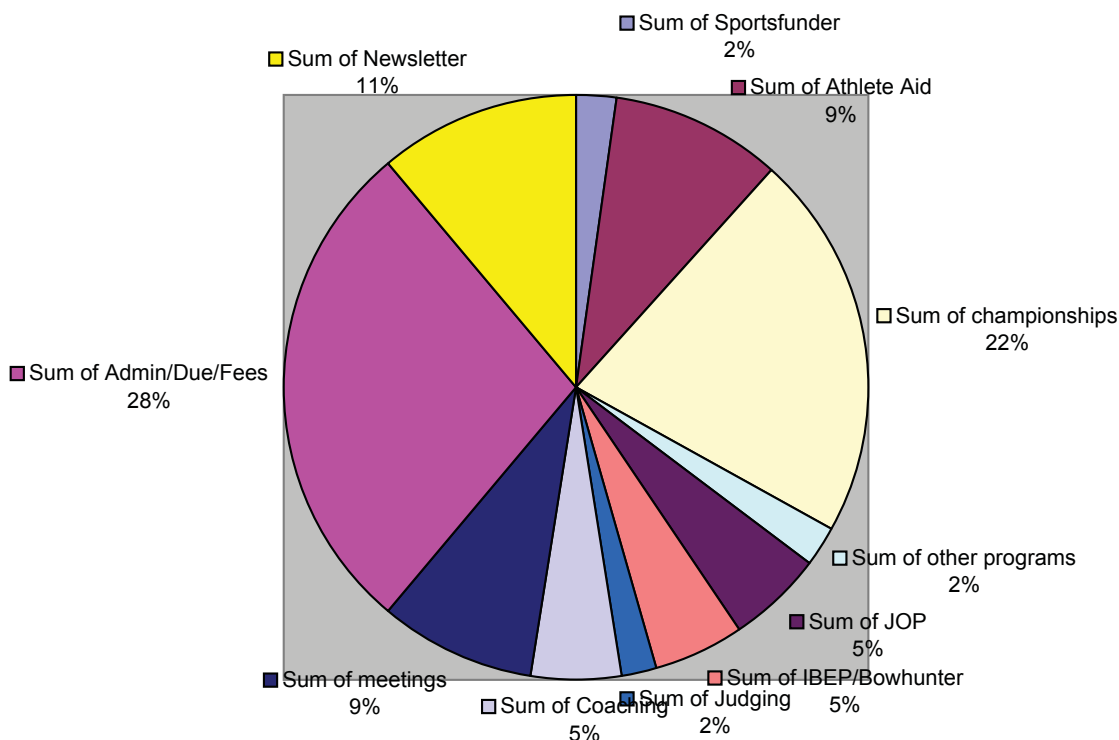
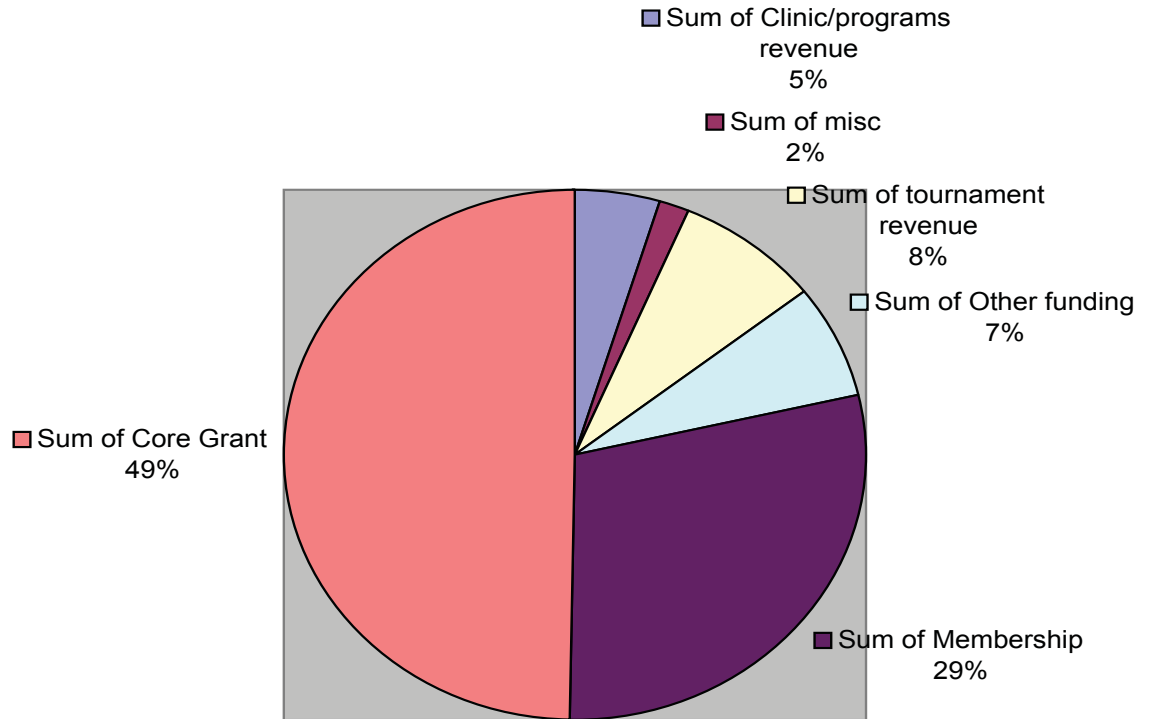

# 2009 Disability Games

## About the Games

The BC Games are three days of competition, but they are about much more. In 1993, the BC Sport and Fitness Council for the Disabled formed a partnership with the BC Games Society and the Games became one of five sets of multi-sport Games which are the BC Family of Games – the BC Summer, BC Winter Games, BC Northern Winter Games, BC Seniors Game and the BC Disability Maple Ridge and Pitt Meadows have a long history of supporting a variety of provincial athletic competitions from two sets of Summer Games in 1983 and 1998 to a previous BC Games for the Physically Disabled in 1992 to numerous provincial and national sporting events.. These communities pull out all the stops when it comes to hospitality and volunteerism.

## History of the Disability Games

The Games were hosted by the Canadian Wheelchair Sports Association – Bc Division from 1968-1985, the Games were under the direction of BC Sport and Fitness Council for the Disabled. In 1995 the Games underwent a name change and became officially known as the BC Games for the Athletes with a Disability. And, in 2000, another name change brought forth the BC Disability Games under the direction of the Council's new name, BC Disability Sports. The latest change, in 2008, brings the Games and the charitable organization together under one name, Bc Disability Games.

BC Disability Sports is a leading non-profit organization promoting awareness of sport and recreation of British Columbians with disabilities.

In partnership with the BC Games Society and host communities, BC Disability Sports manages the BC Disability Games, a multi-disability/multi-sport event that promotes and encourages physical activity and achievement.

Other services and programs include Strength of Ability, Paralympic Pride and the BC Olympic/Paralympic Youth Leadership Academy. BC Disability Sports also serves as a central resource and referral centre in British Columbia.

## Vision of the Disability Games

All British Columbians with disabilities will have the opportunity to participate in sport.

## Give It A Go Event

The BC Disability Games provides athletes with a disability the opportunity to compete in a variety of sport and recreation activities. This year at "GIVE IT A GO" events everyone has the opportunity to participate in a number of adaptive demonstration sports under the guidance of a dynamic coaching team.

## **Did You Know?...**

In 3,300 BC - a 45 yr. old man dies on the Similaun Glacier in the Alps near the present day border between Italy and Austria. His preserved body is found on 11th. September, 1991. After many years of research, “Oetzi” has revealed how he once lived and worked.

He was dressed in leather clothes with a grass waterproof cloak and shoes stuffed with grass as protection against the weather. He also had a framed backpack, a utility belt containing tools, a quiver containing 14 arrows, a flint dagger and a copper axe. His quiver had a protective flap to keep the feathers dry on the arrows. The wooden arrows were fitted with flint arrowheads. Some of his arrows were shorter than the others and seemed to have been made by a right-handed person indicated by the direction of the thread used to tie on the feathers. The other arrows were longer and made by a left-handed person. Why he had two different lengths of arrows remains unknown.

During the more recent investigation of the body, a flint arrowhead was been found embedded in his left shoulder. Someone had shot him in the back with an arrow not long before he died.

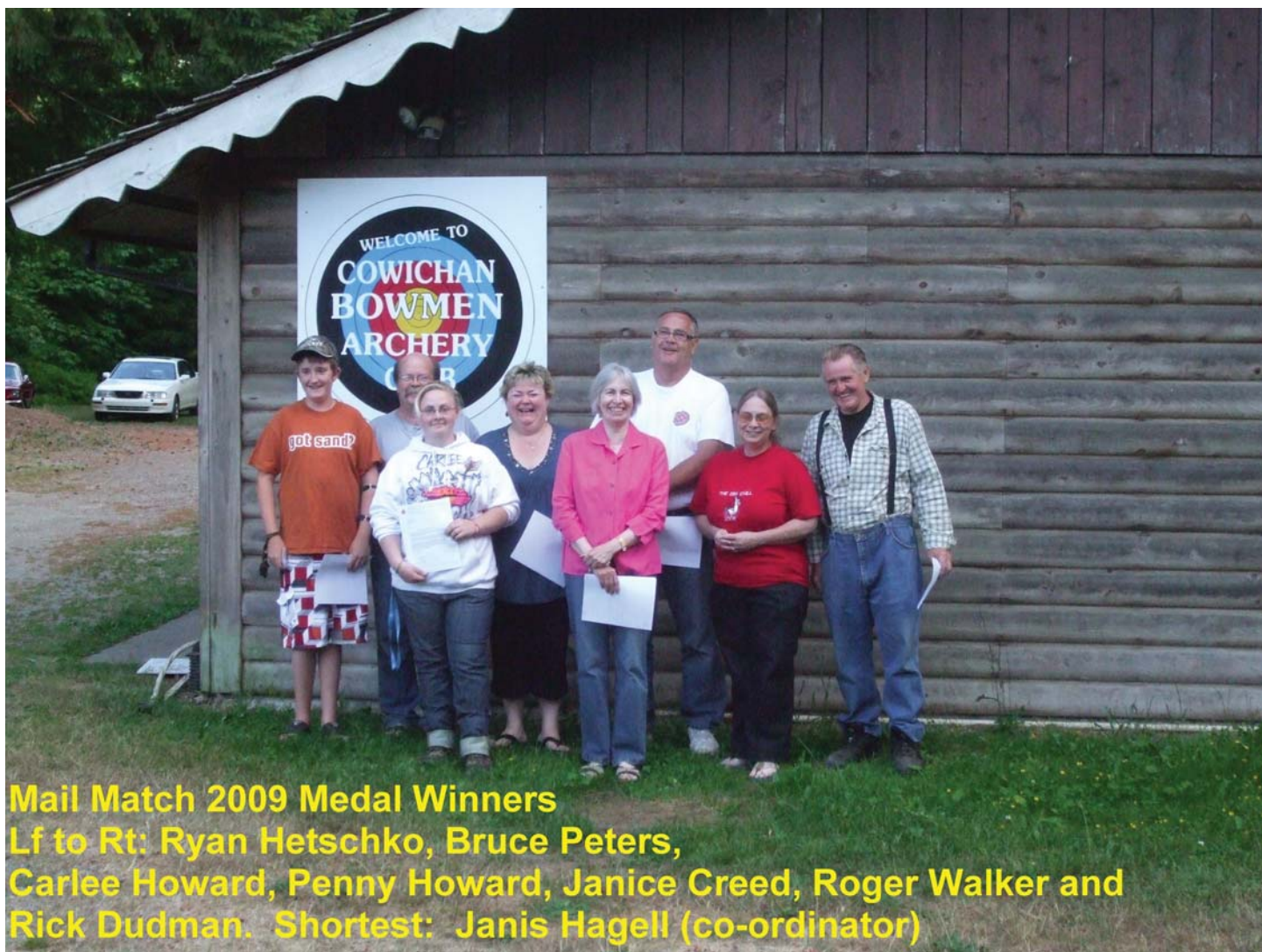

The 3D season is in full swing, with many shoots being held around the province. Attendance is moderate. We have a few new clubs coming on board in various locations. The Provincials were held in Fort St John for the second year in a row. It has been our practice to allow clubs to host the Provincial 3D for two years in order to help cover the cost associated with new targets. Fort St John is quite remote in the North of the Province so attendance was low. Next year the 3D Provincials will be held in Williams Lake.

We had six competitors at the 3D Nationals in Amos Quebec. We had five Medals, four gold and one bronze.

The results are as follows:

Samantha Wright, Michael Wright, Al Campsall, and Spencer Gull all took gold.

Ted Kennedy took bronze, and Franco Longo held his own in a very competitive open class.

The three courses were very challenging with many small and critter size targets at 30 to 50 yards. Next year the 3D Nationals will be held in Halifax, Nova Scotia.

# You and the Rules

## **Range inspection when is it required and how should it be done**

Well the rule book doesn't cover this aspect of the game we call archery but the biggest thing that we focus on is safety. When you walk through the bush like we did at the last Bow Hunting championships it is very easy to get turned around and not know exactly where you are at. So in the past we have done a system of one group of judges or judge being at one stake and the next group or individual goes to the next shooting position and we would see if we could ensure that it was a safe position. Well this can be a very difficult task, but at this Provincial 3D Championships I tried my new GPS with the track back being on so I could see where I was and having marked the shooting positions and direction of the shot was able to determine if there was a position that was not safe. It worked very well and I would recommend this to everyone who sets up a 3D round or a field round you do the inspection yourself as this will speed up the inspection of the judges and maybe the need to move a shot. It is very helpful if the GPS has the maps installed so that the difference in elevation can also be checked if one shot is pointing towards another one.

## **Did I find a shot that was a concern, yes?**

The one shot that caused me some concern was one that we were to shoot down hill but if the archer was to draw in the perfect "T" formation then bend down the shot could be a danger to another shooting spot further away due to the lack of trees being high enough to stop a stray shot; but it was a very challenging shot and the organizers wanted to keep it so I said "put up a barrier" so out came a sheet of plywood and the only spot that it could be placed was very close to the shooting position but it simulated a tree stand that had only a down hill shot. It was a little disturbing for some of the shooters as they were drawing at a wood wall. There is a rule that says:

## **7.7.7 Unsafe Drawing Technique**

When drawing back the string of his or her bow an athlete must not use any technique which, in the opinion of the Judges, could allow the arrow, if accidentally released, to fly beyond a safety zone or safety arrangements (overshoot area, net, wall etc.). If an athlete persists in using such a technique, he or she will, in the interest of safety, be asked by the Chairperson of the Judges Commission and/or the Director of Shooting to stop shooting immediately and to leave the field.

So when you are shooting you must be concerned how you draw your bow; drawing up in the air and lowering down on the target is not allowed, if that target is missed where will your arrow land. People who set up these shots must also be thinking this way when the round is set up, the bear (or other such shots) in the tree if missed where the arrow will land? You must consider all of this when setting up any archery event and that is why your club is suppose to have every venue checked by a judge or safety office before you run your shoot.

If you would like to have a judging clinic run in your area contact me this training is very beneficial for you as a shooter a coach and anyone who would like to know more about the rules, for if we have no judges we will not have any organized events.

So please consider the rules when you set up an event and try to run your event by the rules so that every different club doesn't have different rules because they think that their rules make the game simpler when in fact they just cause confusion in the archery community.

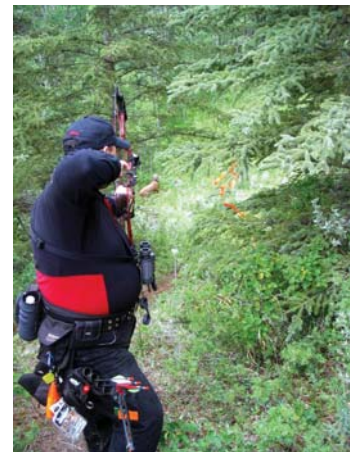
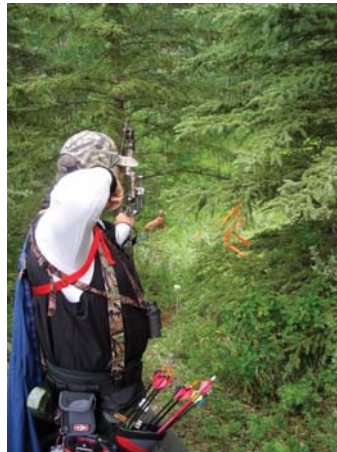
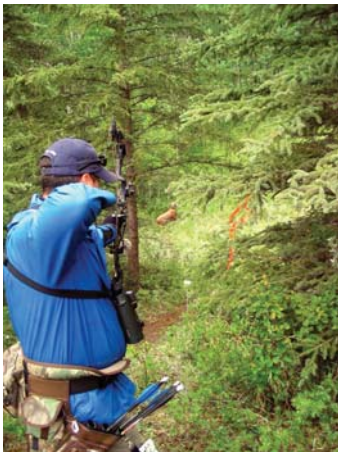
